The donated papers and manuscripts described below have either been in the College since before 1987 or were accepted by personal arrangement by the Honorary Librarian in the 1990s. **The College Archives now has a Collections Development Policy which enables us to accept and manage personal papers according to acceptable archival standards.**

Dr BM Barraclough

Four boxes of Dr Barraclough's records were given to the College Library in 1991; the contents are described in Dr Barraclough's letters to Dr Berrios, 1991, copies of which are in the first box and on the archivist's 'Archives: correspondence with donors' file. The contents have not been sorted and so Dr Barraclough's original arrangement has been preserved. Paper clips etc have not been removed.

The files on the Curb project, Eliot Slater's tribute and the survey of neurosurgical units, all late 1970s, have been labelled by Dr Barraclough and appear to be in order. The psychosurgery papers do not appear to have been put into any order and could be sorted for duplicate reports, minutes, etc.

Dr DH Clark

Dr Clark gave one box of his records to the College Library in 1991; see letter of 15 May 1991 on the archivist's 'Archives: correspondence with donors' file. Dr Alexander Walk

Dr Walk was a historian of psychiatry and long-time librarian of the RMPA and the College. After his death, his widow sorted papers relating to his historical interests and gave them to the College. There are seven large boxes of notes plus a smaller box containing printed pamphlets and indexes.

Professor Dame Sue Bailey

Professor Dame Sue Baily is currently a Consultant Child & Adolescent Forensic Psychiatrist at Greater Manchester West Mental Health NHS Foundation Trust and has worked in the field of child psychiatry for over 30 years. Professor Bailey appeared as an expert witness in the James Bulger murder trial in 1993, and spent several years working with Jon Venables, one of the killers, to get him to accept responsibility for this crime. Professor Bailey was president of the Royal College of Psychologists between June 2011 and June 2014. As President of the Royal College of Psychiatrists, she has worked with health and social care professionals, patients and carers to bring about Parity of Esteem between mental and physical health. From 2001 to 2005 she was chair of the Child and Adolescent Faculty, and from 2005-2010 she was Registrar of the College. After she completed her term as president, she donated 1 box of items from her office including reports, promotional DVDs and CD-ROM guides.
