Her career has been committed to tackling the preventable causes of mental ill health in populations, developing leaders with the skills to increase equitable access to high quality, effective services, delivered by well trained and supported staff, in the best of modern estates with digital and technology innovations. She is passionate about empowering patients and staff to develop their potential, and promote kind, compassionate, least restrictive care, that achieves optimal social and clinical outcomes for patients and high-quality job roles for staff.

Dr Strathdee's roles include, National Professional Adviser at the Care Quality Commission, Non-Executive Director at South London and Maudsley NHSFT, and Community Health Partnerships, Vice Patron, Poppy Factory, Co-founder, Zero Suicide Alliance & Transformational Informatics lead, Clinical adviser, London's urgent and emergency care programme, Visiting Professor, integrated care, University College London.

Malti Varshney is a strategic clinical leader with experience of over 30 years of working in the public and voluntary sectors. As a Public Health expert, Malti has held board-level roles, providing expertise in developing and implementing equitable population health strategies across health and care services. She has successful history of working in partnership for delivery of multi organisational transformation projects.

In her current role as the Director of Strategic Change and Population Health in NHS Kent and Medway Integrated Care Board, Malti is working in partnership with front-line multidisciplinary professionals to champion the application of population health approaches. She is passionate about applying improvement science methodologies to address health inequalities and improve outcomes.

Before joining the ICB Malti held a variety of leadership portfolios at the Regional and National levels in the NHS. As the Director of Clinical Networks and Senate in London, she provided leadership for large-scale clinical transformational for key long-term conditions with a specific focus on addressing unwarranted clinical variation. Prof Subodh Dave

Subodh (pronounced – Soo -both but replace t with a d) was elected as Dean in 2021. He holds this role until 2026. He has overall responsibility for setting standards for and facilitating the effective delivery of psychiatric education and training.

Subodh is an international medical graduate having done his MD and DNB (Psychiatry) from Grant Medical College, Mumbai, India. He moved to the UK in 1995 and obtained his CCT in General Adult Psychiatry with an endorsement in Liaison Psychiatry. He works as Consultant Liaison Psychiatrist in Derbyshire Healthcare Foundation Trust and is Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Bolton. He is Deputy Director of Undergraduate Medical Education and in that role has led innovations in introducing and embedding simulation and lived-experience involvement in the training of medical students at the University of Nottingham.

Subodh has held training roles at all levels spanning undergraduate, foundation and postgraduate training both in the UK and internationally.

He is passionate about ensuring that training, assessment structures and CPD (Continuing Professional Development) programmes lead to improvements in patient care and clinical outcomes.

To that effect, his key priorities are:

1. **Address health inequalities:** faced by patients with mental illness often compounded by other disadvantages for e.g. poverty, early-life trauma, race and gender-based discrimination.
 - a. Integrate advances in neurosciences and social sciences to increase focus on public mental health and personalised care in our training and assessment.
 - b. Patient-focused use of data/digital tools and embedding lived-experience to make our training and practice more rewarding for learners and patients.
2. **Improve well-being:** Happy doctors = Happy patients. Making learning personally fulfilling, meaningful, intellectually stimulating, emotionally engaging and fun.

Kirsten Windfuhr,

Associate Director, Mental Health, Learning Disability, ASD (MHLDA) NHS Benchmarking Network

Kirsten joined the Network in 2021 and is Associate Director for Insight and Analytics. Kirsten and her team deliver bespoke analytic and national benchmarking projects for NHS and non-statutory provider organisations as well as local, regional and national organisations.

A research psychologist by background, Kirsten has worked at the University of Manchester as an academic researcher at the National Confidential Inquiry into Suicide and Safety in Mental Health and the NIHR funded Greater Manchester Applied Research Collaborative Mental Health programme. Her interests and publications have focussed on suicide prevention, mental health, and health services research more broadly. As Associate Director for Quality and Development at the Healthcare Quality Improvement Partnership (HQIP) she was responsible for commissioning national clinical audit programmes across clinical areas including mental health before taking on a strategic commissioning role for local health and care services as Director of Integrated Commissioning at Manchester Health and Care Commissioning.

Dr Bachlani works as Consultant Psychiatrist and Clinical Lead for the Autism/ASC pathway at Priory Woking Hospital. Asif is also an Associate Non-Executive Director (NED) for Kent and Medway NHS and Social Care Partnership Trust with his portfolios being data and digital. Asif has held various managerial and digital positions in NHS and independent sector including Clinical Director, Clinical Lead for Mental Health Outcomes and Chief Clinical Information Officer. Asif has also been the NHS London Clinical Lead for Mental Health Outcomes for 2 years (2017-19). In this role, In this role, Asif has co-authored various policy documents and papers around data and digital include NHS London Introduction to HoNOS, the HoNOS analytical framework and Healthy London Partnership Development of Primary Care Mental Health Models.

Asif has had an interest in clinical value of data and data literacy for clinicians. Asif set up 1st ever data events for clinicians initially regionally in 2018 and then nationally from 2019 via RCPsych Better Data, Better Care series of conferences which is now in its 5th year.
